- Massacre at the tomb of the patriarchs
- Israel and Jordan Sign Peace Treaty
- Beginning of the Second Intifada

2001 – 2004

- Taba Negotiations
- UN States Sponsors UN Security Council Resolution Calling for a Palestinian State alongside the state of Israel
- Hamas Suicide Attacks

2005 - present

- Hamas and Islamic Jihad Agree to Suspend Attacks on Israel
- Israel-Lebanon War
- Hamas Takes over Gaza, Abbas Swears in New West Bank Government, and Israel Blockade Gaza
